1 MILSET Europe – General Information

MILSET Europe is a European non-governmental, non-profit and politically independent youth organisation, created gathering organisations working in the field of education, focusing on the organisation of science-and-technology activities for young people.

MILSET was founded in 1987 in Quebec, during the first Expo-Sciences International. Due to its constant growth, various regional branches have been formed to-date, namely,

- MILSET Europe
- MILSET Amlat (Latin America)
- MILSET Noram (North America)
- MILSET Africa
- MILSET Asia
- MILSET Vostok

As a member of the world civil society, MILSET is also a stakeholder in the current revolution of the Technologies of Information and Communication, and advocates the free sharing of knowledge and the building of true knowledge sharing societies.

Thanks to MILSET, tens of thousands of young people have already met to exchange and make the most of their creations, discuss with researchers, youth leaders and industrialists. They have developed projects together, discovered foreign languages and cultures, and have been trained to acquire new technologies.

Joining MILSET is adhering to its charter, that of a movement, which is concerned about today's world, participates in the local development of scientific and technical education in leisure, promotes international cooperation, sustainable development, citizenship and peace, by practicing sciences and technology in a spirit of respect, understanding and solidarity within different geographic and spiritual communities.

MILSET is an official partner of UNESCO.

1.2 MILSET mission & objectives

MILSET supports its member organisations to engage youth in science, technology, engineering, mathematics and the arts (STEAM) through motivation, cooperation, collaboration, and networking. We do this by:

- Helping member organisations create a local or national environment to motivate youth to be involved in STEAM;
- Connecting, supporting, and representing member organisations around the world;
- Stimulating and supporting international youth networking and cooperation through STEAM; and
- Providing member organisations with global opportunities to engage youth in STEAM.

2 Activities

MILSET Europe has organised many different activities during this year. These activities are categorised into youngsters' oriented grouped by the headline Young Torches for Science on one hand and member oriented grouped by the headline Youth Science Factory on the other.

A series of major national and international wide activities communicated by the member/partner organisations as well as selected external activities are promoted on the website and on MILSET's Facebook group developing the role of a central information platform for MILSET.

The idea of the "Young Torches for Science" is to bring science directly to the youth around Europe; we want to offer the youngsters opportunities to deal with science – to look behind the phenomenon, to ask "why". We want to light up science with our torches.

2.1.3.1 Young Citizens Conferences on Energy

The Young Citizens Conferences on Science Learning by MILSET are dedicated to express the views and ideas of youth regarding their concerns on science learning, science education and accessibility, science means of communication and others by gathering their voices from every part of the globe encouraging them to enter actively the debate.

We are confident that the open-mindedness of young people combined with a scientific approach will yield important contributions. Our primary goals will be reached through a series of activities following a 3 step methodology: "Observations, Causes and Actions".

2.1.4 Contests

2.1.4.1 MILSET Science Photo Contest 2017 (SPC 2017)

The MILSET Science Photo Contest 2016 welcomed 650 pictures from 26 countries from 1st February to 1st June 2017, which is the highest amount of pictures received, following the motto: "When art meets science":

The winner was Bernard Li Recirido from the Philippines. Antoine van Ruymbeke, project leader, and Denisa Kalužová, Art Director coordinated the contest.

The idea of this activity is to link knowledge, observation, art and people. The category of the SPC is scientific phenomena. Through this contest, MILSET Europe aims to create a leeway for youths to express creatively in pictures what they observe in science.

The objectives are:

- Discover science in a new perspective;
- Link science observation and artistic expression;
- Promote youths' interest in science.

Different publications and exhibitions were done with the finalists/winning pictures which all received a diploma.

2.1.5 Projects

2.1.5.1 European Science Day for Youth 2017

The ESDY 2017 took place on 16th March all over Europe, with the theme "Sustainability". All participants received a diploma certifying their participation.

The activity was coordinated by Denisa Kalužová (Czech Republic) and advised by Antoine van Ruymbeke (Belgium).

This common activity of MILSET Europe was further established among MILSET Europe members and enlarged the number of participating youngsters with its objectives being:

- To show that Science is Fun
- To serve as an example of youths' interest in science and research
- To stimulate youths' decision-making ability and creativity
- To promote youth and interschool cooperation
- To enforce a European identity among young people

2.2 Members oriented: Youth Science Factory

3 Organisational Structure

3.1 Legal seat

The legal seat of MILSET Europe is located at Avenue Latérale 17, 1180 Brussels, Belgium.

The place belongs to the “Jeunesses Scientifiques de Belgique” and a contract was made to host MILSET Europe free of charge and to have access to an office.

MILSET Europe is registered as an AISBL under the Belgian law. The enterprise number is 821 181 115.

3.2 General Assembly

The General Assembly 2017 met in Fortaleza, Brazil, on 8th August 2017 during the Expo-Sciences International. The attendees were:
